1. Will my financial aid cover my participation on a Dialogue? What is covered?

- a. Institutional sources of financial aid such as Merit Scholarships (Honors, Deans, Connections, National Merit/Recognition) and Northeastern University Grant funds, are awarded during a Dialogue of Civilization. These funds will be prorated to reflect 50% of your standard per-term amount. For example, if you receive a \$10,000 Dean's Scholarship for a full course load (12-16cr), your Dean's Scholarship for a Dialogue would be \$5,000 for an 8cr Dialogue.
- b. Federal sources of financial aid may vary based on previous eligibility for the Fall and Spring terms. You must have a valid FAFSA on file to receive Federal financial aid.
- c. Federal Work Study is **not** available during a Dialogue of Civilization.

2. Do I need to submit a new FAFSA to be considered for Dialogue aid?

a. No, you do not need to submit a new FAFSA to be considered for aid for a Dialogue. Your financial aid offer encompasses Fall, Spring and Summer for the full academic year.

3. Is there anything i need to do to be considered for summer financial aid?

a. No, you do not need to do anything beyond registration. Once Student Financial Services receives notice of your Summer registration, we will update your offer of financial assistance accordingly. Summer awarding typically occurs early to mid-April.

4. How does this impact future financial aid usage?

a. As part of the Northeastern Promise, Merit Scholarships and Northeastern Grant are promised for up to eight in-class semesters. A Dialogue of Civilizations counts as a ½ semester towards the promised eight.

5. How does billing work for a Dialogue?

a. Students will be billed the Summer 1 or Summer 2 session <u>tuition rate</u> directly through Northeastern. Additionally, each student will be billed a Dialogue of Civilizations Fee. The Dialogue fee varies by program. Please consult with the Global Experience Office (GEO) for more information about the DOC Fee.
